Behaviour Management Procedure

I am attaching our Behaviour Management procedures to this newsletter. These procedures are taken directly from our Student Wellbeing Procedures. Please take the time to read these with your child so they are aware of the consequences of poor behaviour. Sign and return the slip at the end to the class teacher to confirm you have read our procedures.

Attendance

It is a requirement of the Department of Education for parents and carers to explain all absences of their children. Absentee notes can be sent in with your child, emailed to the school or you can provide a verbal explanation via the phone. We now send a text when your child is not at school and you can just reply via Skoolbag or phone the office. If an absence goes unexplained for 7 days, a reminder note will be sent home.

This year we are having a sausage sizzle each term for students who attend 95% and any absences are justified (ie an explanation was given that is acceptable). At the end of the year students with 100%

attendance receive an award and students with 95% or above are recognised.

Point Wooli Sport

Because of the difficulty with getting all student health care information for sport on Friday, we have had to postpone the start of our program until next week. Please understand this has been very difficult for everyone involved to manage. I thank those parent who have gone to considerable trouble to get the information done, especially those who have put the information in more than once. The power-outage in Gwandalan and Summerland Point overnight has further complicated an already complicated situation. Students last session will now be the first week of term 2 so that they get all sessions that they have paid for.

"Our job isn't to protect them, not from everything

Witnessing the suffering of our children is a difficult burden to bear, no matter how old they are. It's helpful if we remind ourselves it's not our job to protect our kids from life's hardships, but to steer and guide them, and to help them get back up again when life knocks them down..." "Our role as parents in helping them do just that can never be underestimated. They learn so much from us that builds their confidence and resilience, and helps them handle anxiety when it crops up."





Behaviour Management Procedures - 2020

A school record is kept for each offence that breaches our school expectations and each incident will be judged according to its severity. For each offence that is at notification level or above a letter outlining the details of each offence will be sent home.

Notification	 You have chosen to do one of the following: Continual disruption Sent to Buddy Class e.g. disruption Non-compliance Inappropriate play Inappropriate conflict resolution (verbal/physical) Teasing/Harassment 	A notification is given to you for your parents explaining what you have done. WITHDRAWAL OF PRIVILEGES

Should a student's history of unacceptable behaviour indicate that he or she might compromise the safety or welfare of himself/herself or other students, the school reserves the right to withdraw that child from an activity or excursion.

Indicators of unsuitability for inclusion on excursions or activities are a history of: violence, disobedience, non-cooperation or abuse of others.

SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

There is provision for each student of special needs to be viewed on an individual basis. In particular, students with a diagnosed disability need to have their special circumstances considered in the event of any disciplinary action. Students identified as high risk will have an Individual Behaviour Plan.
